The *Artists' Prison* looks askance at the workings of personality and privilege, sexuality, authority, and artifice in the art world. Imagined through the heavily

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redacted testimony of the prison's warden, written by Alexandra Grant, and powerfully allusive images by Eve Wood, the prison is a brutal, Kafkaesque landscape where creativity can be a criminal offence and sentences range from the allegorical to the downright absurd.
